In a special session for novice editors—Love, Desire, and Tension: Structural Editing of Nonfiction—James Harbeck will discuss how editors can help nonfiction writers build suspense and adventure into the structure of their writing. The session will focus on structural editing and ways editors help build tension in nonfiction.

Good structure is not like a building, with stone squarely on stone and rooms all in good order. It's like a suspension bridge, held together by the tension between the reader's desire and its fulfillment. Nonfiction readers start because they desire to know something, but they keep reading because it's an adventure, and they're the hero. They want to be toyed with, frustrated and rewarded. ### Ethics and Inclusion: Being Clear/Fair/True

In the session **Ethics and Inclusion: Being Clear/Fair/True**, **Jaqueline McLeod Rogers** will discuss ethical writing and story-telling. This general session will focus on three components for drawing and building an inclusive audience: ethics and clarity, ethics and power, and ethics and truth.

Ethical writing and story-telling is essential for drawing and building an inclusive audience. We can approach ethics as having three key components: (1) Ethics and clarity: consider how revising to foreground S-V sentence development promotes clarity, cuts stall and clutter, and produces prose that has the inclusive appeal of clarity rather than obfuscation; (2) Ethics and power: thinking about the powerful role of the "I" voice of the teller, and the need to decide rather to stake one's position or function more objectively as interpretive filtre; (3) Ethics and truth: consider the situational and generic demands to report facts that replicate the actual event or experience,





### **Conscious Language and Copyediting Fiction**

**Amy J. Schneider** will discuss how and when a copyeditor should call out and suggest revisions for potentially harmful language in the general session **Conscious Language and Copyediting Fiction**.

Conscious language is a growing area of interest for editors, and it applies to fiction as well as nonfiction. Language in fiction (in both narration and dialogue) that is sexist, racist, ageist, ableist, homophobic, or transphobic, although it may seek to reflect real life and further the story, can be harmful to readers. At the copyediting stage, these issues may or may not have been discussed or reviewed, and the copyeditor may need to attend to them. This session will discuss how and when a copyeditor should call out and suggest revisions for potentially harmful language. Topics include descriptions of characters, spotting bias in action and dialogue, technical representation of dialogue and non-English language, authentic representation of culture and religion, how to query and discuss conscious language issues in fiction with both indie authors and publishers, and useful resources for keeping up with current discussions of conscious language.

The most important job a fiction editor can do is help an author make their manuscript into the best version of itself—the best possible version of the book the author wants to write. To that end, I will discuss how to identify and work with considerations of genre and audience; more importantly, how to understand what your author is trying to accomplish, and how you can best help them achieve that goal.
